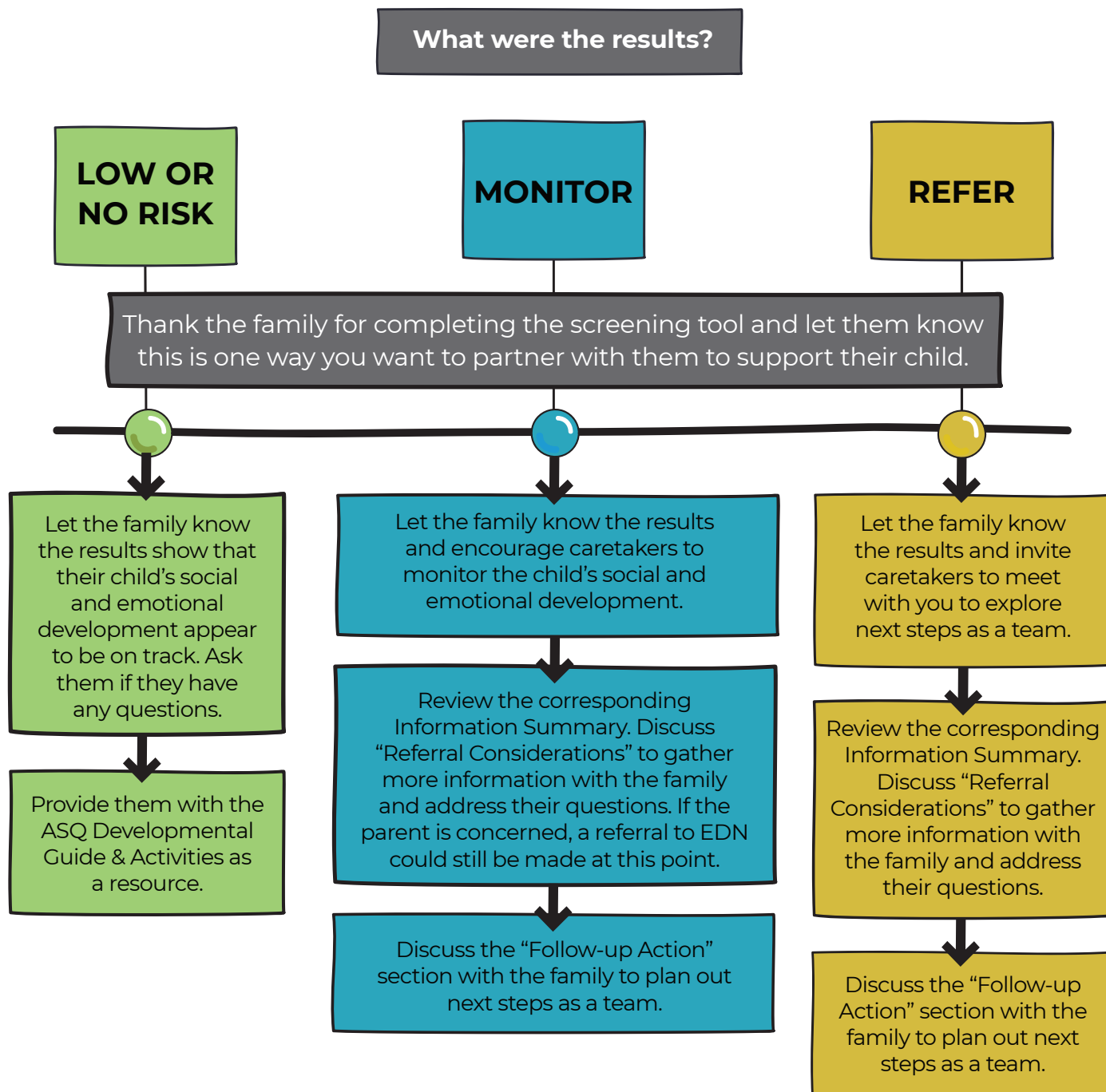


Ages & Stages Questionnaires®:

Tell Me About the ASQ-SE

What is the ASQ-SE?

- The ASQ-SE stands for Ages and Stages Questionnaire – Social Emotional. The screening tool helps caregivers identify potential delays or areas of concern in a child's developmental process.

Why is completing the ASQ-SE important?

- Monitoring children's development is an important step to ensure they grow and mature into healthy adults. Early identification of concerns can prevent small issues from becoming larger issues later in life. The ASQ-SE is one tool that can be used as part of this process.

Who completes the ASQ-SE?

- It is preferred that parents complete the tool; however, when that option is not possible, other caregivers that know the child well can also use it.

When is the ASQ-SE completed?

- The Rooted in Relationships initiative asks child care providers to work with families to complete the tool every September. However, parents and caregivers may choose to use it more frequently if they have concerns.

Where should the ASQ-SE be completed?

- Anywhere that is convenient for the parent! In fact, some communities have found it helpful to have parents complete the tool at the early childhood program before or after drop-off and pick-up to increase the completion rate.
